## District Superintendents, School Board Trustees, and School Administration,

I am not anti-vax, but I am pro-choice when it comes to this very new vaccine for a virus that our children are extremely resilient to. Many students have already had COVID and have significant natural immunity. There is no reason to vaccinate our children to protect those who are at higher risk because if the vaccine works they are protected. We also know the virus can still be transmitted after vaccination.

Our group is large and diverse - No one should be shamed or medically segregated. We stand vaccinated and unvaccinated, against mandates, for choice. We want to see long term studies before we would even consider getting our children this vaccine. Our society has ways of mitigating the risk from this virus without placing this burden on our children who are least impacted by the disease and most vulnerable to side effects.

The risk from adverse reactions to the vaccine such as myocarditis outweigh any possible benefits to youth who are at very low risk from the virus while clearly harming students who choose not to get vaccinated by denying their right to in-person education and on campus activities. Under California State Law we know our children have a right to personal belief exemptions for this new vaccine and in person education. We have already filed a lawsuit against the second largest school district in this state who is violating those rights.

Coercion is not consent. We insist that you advocate to the State on behalf of your students. Tell the Governor and CDPH that this mandate is unnecessary and not in the best interest of our children, and that you will not enforce it. These shoes represent a child who has a right and wants to continue to walk into their classroom for an education.
